IAN MACLEAN is Professor of Renaissance Studies in the University of Oxford and a Senior Research Fellow of All Souls College. Among his publications are *The Renaissance Notion of Woman* (1980, frequently reprinted), *Meaning and Interpretation in the Renaissance: The Case of Law* (1992), *Montaigne philosophe* (1996), *Logic, Signs and Nature in the Renaissance: The Case of Learned Medicine* (2001), and an edition of Cardano's *De libris propriis* (2004).

This masterclass forms part of the symposium **Humanism and Medicine in the Early Modern Era**, taking place 20-22 September 2006 at the University Club, UWA. The symposium is co-presented by the ARC Network for Early European Research (NEER).

Professor Maclean will present the ARC Network for Early European Research Lecture -- *The Medical Republic of Letters in Europe before the Thirty Years War* -- on Thursday 21 September at 4-5pm.

The IAS Masterclass program combines a visit to UWA by a distinguished scholar with a session involving a group of presentations by postgraduate students.

Over a one-day period, students present short papers on their own research or interests within the framework of the stated topic, and each presentation is then discussed by the group.

We hope that the ambience of the IAS makes the occasion special for the participants, separate from their usual environments and free of departmental associations, a particularly useful feature for cross-disciplinary groups.

All interested students and staff from Perth universities are invited to attend.

This is a cross-disciplinary masterclass and submissions are welcome across all relevant disciplines.

We are aiming for no more than four papers to be given during the morning; the afternoon will be devoted to a round-table discussion.

Places are available for those who wish to attend but do not wish to give a paper.
